

DC Unemployment Assistance

The Federal CARES Act was signed into law March 27, 2020. The Act provides Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) to D.C. Residents

PANDEMIC

How to Apply in DC? (FOLLOW THESE TWO STEPS)

FIRST, file for regular unemployment benefits before completing the PUA application

Information Needed for Claiming

Unemployment Benefits:

- x Your social security number;
- x Alien Registration Number, if not a US Citizen;
- x Your DD214, if you are ~~ex~~military;
- x Your Standard Form 8 or Standard Form 50, if you are a former federal employee;
- x Severance pay information if you did or will receive severance pay;
- x Pension information if you are receiving a pension payment);
- x Evidence of a public health emergency impact (if applying due to the coronavirus (COVID19) public health emergency).
- x Documentation may include:
 - x A letter documenting a voluntary request or involuntary order to isolate or quarantine from a medical professional or local health official
 - x A note from your medical provider or medical records office recommending isolation or quarantine
 - x A selfdetermination that the Department quarantine guidance applies to you

SECOND, file a PUA Application

You may need to provide additional supporting documentation about your work and income history, the DC Department of Employment Services will review documentation including but not limited to:

- x tax returns;
- x paycheck stubs;
- x bank receipts;
- x ledgers;
- x contracts;
- x invoices; and/or
- x billing statements
